- We Don't Leave Notices About Water Quality – If you find a flyer or door hanger claiming your water is unsafe, it did not come from El Paso Water. Any official communication from us will always include our El Paso Water logo.
- Beware of Door-to-Door Sales Pitches Some companies try to sell costly and unnecessary water filtration systems by making alarming claims about water quality. Rest assured—your tap water is safe to drink and meets all state and federal health standards.
- We Will Never Ask to Test Your Tap Water If water testing is needed, it is conducted by certified professionals in a laboratory. If someone asks to test your water in your home, it's likely not valid.

Water Quality FAQ's

At El Paso Water, providing safe, high-quality drinking water is our top priority. Every time you turn on the tap, you can feel confident knowing that your water meets and exceeds all safety and quality standards.

Why Is My Tap Water Sometimes Cloudy?

Cloudy water is normally caused by air that enters the pipes and then escapes in your tap water in the form of oxygen bubbles. Air bubbles do not present a health risk. This cloudiness should disappear in a few minutes of running the tap. You can also fill a clear glass with tap water and watch as it clears after a few minutes.

What Causes Water To Appear Discolored?

Dirty pipes is the typical cause of discolored water. In some cases, rusty or dirty water may come from the distribution system as the result of a main break or fire hydrant use. Usually, rusty water will clear after running cold water for a few minutes. Although rusty or dirty water does not create a health risk, we recommend that you do NOT drink water that is not clear.
