To Whom It May Concern:

Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center El Paso (TTUHSCEP) is a public institution of higher education for the State of Texas. Under federal law, state governments and related state institutions, including state institutions of higher education, are exempt from taxation. TTUHSCEP, as an organization described in Internal Revenue Code sections 170(b)(1)(A)(v) and 170(c)(1), is exempt from federal income tax under the constitutional law doctrine of intergovernmental tax immunity. 26 C.F.R. § 1.511-1—1.513-4. An exception to this provision would apply if a division or activity of TTUHSCEP generated unrelated business income. See 26 U.S.C. § 511(a)(2). Chapter 110 of the Texas Education Code describes the establishment and sets forth the authorities of TTUHSCEP (see link below).
