The proposal deadline is **March 22, 2013**. You are strongly encouraged to submit abstracts as soon as possible. Since the conference program must be finalized and presenters notified in time for preconference coordination, it may not be possible to accept late proposals.

1. Deadline for abstract submission is **March 22, 2013**
2. Presentations may be
  - (a) **Data driven- based on research findings**. Data can be quantitative or qualitative

The sections for **data driven abstracts** are:

- a. Title
- b. Purpose
- c. Background
- d. Methods
- e. Results
- f. Conclusions

(b) **Program or case studies (models of care)** with multiple perspectives related to perinatal care

The sections for **program or case studies** are:

- g. Title
- h. Purpose/Issue
- i. Statement of Objectives/strategies
- j. Description
- k. Evaluation or Lessons Learned
- l. Recommendations(next steps)

3. All abstracts must be categorized into one of the following 2 areas:
  - Ethics in Perinatal Care
  - Contexts of Perinatal Care in the Texas/New Mexico-Mexico border region:  
Impact of mother, baby, health care professional and community contexts on the care of the mother and baby (prenatal & postnatal)
4. All abstracts must include at least 2 learning objectives for the session. Abstracts must be limited to 250 words or less (excluding Title and learning objectives) and in Times Roman 12 point font.
5. Abstracts can be submitted for poster sessions. Poster displays must fit 20 inches \*30 inches space.
6. All authors will be notified about the status of their abstracts by March 29, 2013.
