School of Medicine Graduation


Fifty medical students from the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center at El Paso campus joined their peers from the Amarillo and Lubbock campuses for commencement ceremonies held May 20 in Lubbock's United Spirit Arena.

These 117 new doctors will attend residency training programs at numerous medical institutions nationwide. Forty percent of El Paso-based graduates will go into training programs in primary care (either Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, or Pediatrics). Six of the students will train in El Paso on the Texas Tech/Thomason campus.



Resident Physician Graduation

Fifty-seven physicians from TTUHSC at El Paso graduated from residency training in nine specialties on June 16 at the YISD Cultural Arts Center.

Twenty-three graduates are staying in Texas. Ten graduates will stay in El Paso to practice. Two graduates will become TTUHSC at El Paso faculty. Four will practice in New Mexico, and two others will fulfill military obligations. The rest of the twelve will seek fellow-

ship training elsewhere, and four are undecided.

Thirty-five graduates chose primary care specialties such as Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, OB/GYN and Pediatrics.

The physicians have all undergone three to five years of training in either Emergency Medicine, Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Orthopaedic Surgery, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, Surgery or a Transitional Year.

American Medical Association Honors Physician as Emerging Leader in Medicine

Stanislaus Ting, M.D., Allergist, Texas Tech University Health Sciences

Center at El Paso, has been named a recipient of the American Medical Association (AMA) Foundation's 2006 Leadership Award, which provides medical students, residents/fellows, young physicians and international medical graduate physicians from around the country special training to develop their skills as future leaders in organized medicine. The awards are presented in association with the Pfizer Medical Humanities Initiative.

The AMA Foundation honored 55 individuals with the award at its annual Excellence in Medical Awards ceremony in Washington, D.C. Recipients of the award demonstrate outstanding nonclinical leadership skills in advocacy, community service and/or education.

Along with his affiliation to TTUHSC at El Paso, Dr. Ting is the founder and medical director of St. Luke's Clinic, which provides free medical care to thousands of working poor and homeless in Las Cruces, New Mexico since 1991. He is also involved in humanitarian projects in Mexico and Thailand. Dr. Ting designed and published the first low-cost pragmatic asthma tool known as MSAGR © (Multi-colored Simplified Asthma Guidelines Reminder) for clinicians in the trenches to improve their adherence to asthma guidelines. In collaboration with various individuals, clinics, hospitals and organizations, over one million complementary MSAGR © have been disseminated globally.

"Through their committed efforts in advancing health care in their communities, these men and women have shown tremendous potential for being part of the next generation of medical leaders," said Linda B. Ford, M.D., president of the AMA Foundation. "Whether the issues are political or social, I am confident that these talented people will provide solid leadership in the interest of improving health care delivery in our country."
