

# Borderlands HCOP Summer Research Program

Fourteen El Paso students are gaining first-hand experience with research scientists across the city. The students are participants in the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center Borderlands Health Careers Opportunity Program (HCOP) Summer Research Program.

The students, from the Silva Magnet School for Health Professions and the Chapin Engineering Magnet School, completed a research elective course during the school year. Under the Texas Tech Borderlands HCOP Summer research program, the students are building practical research experience. They work with research scientists from Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center at El Paso, the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston School of Public Health and the Texas A&M University El Paso Research and Extension Center.


In addition to their work locally, the students will spend a week at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences in Lubbock working with graduate students and learning about graduate programs in biomedical sciences.

The students are working on research ranging from DNA fluorescence in mammary tumors to soil salinity effects on landscape plants to obesity and hypertension studies.

The summer program will conclude July 14 with a research day featuring the students' presentation of scientific posters on their work.

The Texas Tech Borderlands HCOP is funded through a grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration. The program is under the direction of Jim Hastings, associate director, Texas Tech Office of Border Health and the Borderlands HCOP; and Ricardo Acevedo, science faculty member from the Silva Magnet School for Health Professions.

Texas Tech researchers serving as mentors are Daniel Terreros, M.D. Rajkumar Lakshmanaswamy, Ph.D., and Gudmundur Thordarson, Ph.D., all of the Department of Pathology.
