7.4 Birthday of Queen Sonja - marks the birth in 1937 of Queen Sonja of Norway, the queen consort of Norway and wife of King Harald V
 Commemoration of Jewish Genocide - the official commemoration day of victims of genocide
 Family Day - celebrated the first Monday in July

7.5 Constitution Day – on this day in 1915, the Armenian Armenia people approved the Constitution of the Armenian Republic

Saints Cyril & Methodius Day - The feast day of
Saints Cyril & Methodius, two Greek brothers who
became missionaries of Christianity among the Slavs
of Great Moravia and Pannonia. Through their work
they influenced the cultural development of all Slavic
peoples for which they received the title "Apostles to
the Slavs"

Independence Day – secured independence from Venezuela Spain on this day in 1811

Independence Day - marks independence from France Algeria in 1962

Independence Day – marks independence from Cape Verde Portugal in 1975 Islands

Peace & Unity Day – marks the anniversary of the Rwanda 1973 coup

Tynwald Day (Midsummer Court) – on this day the
Isle of Man
Isle's legislature meets in St. John's instead of
Douglas; the session is held in both the Royal Chapel
of St. John the Baptist and the open air in Tynwald
Hill

Unity Day – created to help foster solidarity between Zambia* the diverse groups that make up the country; celebrated the first Tuesday in July

7.6 **Statehood Day** (Anniversary of the Coronation of King Lithuania Mindaugas) - honors the first known grand Duke of Lithuania who was crowned king in 1251 and is generally considered the founder of the Lithuanian state **Republic Day** - celebrates independence in 1964 Malawi **Independence Day** - anniversary of the declaration of Comoros independence made in 1975 Jan Hus Day - an official public holiday in honor of Czech Republic the Bohemian religious reformer and philosopher Jan Hus, who was condemned as a heretic and burned at the stake on this day in 1415; his teachings inspired the revolutionary Hussite movement, and he remains an inspiring legendary figure Finland Eino Leino Day - honors Eino Leino, poet and first writer to use Finnish fluently for all artistic purposes **Running of the Bulls** – part of the San Fermin Spain Festival; runs in Pamplona from July 6-14 every year 7.7 **Saba Saba** - commemorates the 1954 founding of the Tanzania Tanzanian political party, TANU Tanabata (Star Festival) - according to a Chinese Japan legend, the two stars Altair and Vega, which are usually separated from each other by the Milky Way, are able to meet **Independence Day** - commemorates independence Solomon from Britain in 1978 Islands 7.9 **Independence Day** - marks independence from Spain Argentina in 1816 **Constitution Day** - adopted its constitution in 1981 Palau and establish a government based on the government of the USA

7.9 **Aïd Chebeb** (Youth Day) - celebrates the birthday of Morocco King Hassan II, born in 1929 **Martyrdom of the Bab** - commemorates the arrest, Baha'i torture, imprisonment, and execution of the Bab, the prophet-herald of the faith, in Tabriz, Persia, in 1850; begins at sundown the previous day **Sao Paulo State Rebellion –** in 1932, the people of Brazil (Sao Paulo) Sao Paulo began a military movement against the central government in Rio de Janeiro and the Paulistas; the movement ended in a 3 month civil war 7.10 **Independence Day** - marks independence from the Bahamas United Kingdom in 1973 Birthday of Yang DiPertua Negeri of Penang - to Malaysia* honor the head of state of Penang **Death of El Cid -** marks the anniversary of the death Spain of Rodrigo Diaz de Vivar, known as El Cid Campeador, a Castilian nobleman, gifted military leader and diplomat who, after being exiled, conquered and governed the city of Valencia Belgium Flemish Community Holiday (Guldensporenslad) celebrated on this day every year in remembrance of the Battle of Golden Spurs or Guldensporenslag 7.11 **Gospel Day** Kiribati* Mongolia **Naadam Day -** commemorates the overthrow of the monarch in 1921 and includes horse racing, archery, and wrestling competitions; held July 11-13

7.12 Independence Day - marks independence from Portugal in 1975São Tomé e Príncipe

7.12 **Orangeman's Day** - commemorates the 1690 UK, Scotland Protestant victory over Roman Catholic forces in the Battle of the Boyne in Ireland. King William of Orange, the Protestant King of England, defeated former King James II, a Catholic Battle of the Boyne Day - marks the battle fought in Ireland 1690 between two rival claimants of the English, Scottish, and Irish thrones, the Catholic King James and the Protestant King William, who won the battle Independence Day - marks independence from British Kiribati* Colonial rule in 1979 **Petrovdan** - a feast in honor of the holy apostles Peter Bosnia-Herzegovina and Paul 7.13 **Obon** (Festival of Lanterns) - celebrated from July 13 Japan to 15 in some areas and from August 13 to 15 in others. According to Buddhist beliefs, the dead revisit earth at this time, so lanterns are lit for their souls **Statehood Day** - commemorates the day in 1878 on Montenegro which the Berlin Congress recognized Montenegro as the twenty-seventh independent state in the world **7.14 Emmeline Pankhurst Day -** marks the anniversary of UK Emmeline Pankhurst's birth. Pankhurst was a political activist and leader of the British suffragette movement **Fandoana Bathing Festival** Madagascar **Uniwaine Day** (Elderly Men) Kiribati* **Republic Day** Iraq Sweden Birthday of Crown Princess Victoria – celebrates the birth of Victoria Ingrid Alice Desiree, Crown Princess of Sweden, Duchess of Vastergotland, and heiress apparent of the Swedish throne, born in Stockholm on

this day in 1977

7.14 Bastille Day - commemorates the event that launched the French Revolution. The Bastille held political prisoners and became a symbol of oppression by the monarchy. On this date in 1789 the Bastille was stormed and prisoners freed

7.15 Unaine Day (Elderly Women)

St. Swithin's Day - named after St. Swithin, a Saxon Bishop of Winchester. On this day people watch the weather because tradition says that whatever the weather is like on this day, it will continue so for the next forty days

St. Rosalia Day - a day to honor the patron saint of Palermo, a pious young woman credited for saving the city from a plague in 1624

Italy

Lailat al Baraa (Night of Repentance) – the night when forgiveness is granted to those who repent

Islam*

Asalha Puja – commemorates the Buddha's first sermon in the Deer Park in Benares and the founding of the Buddhist sangha

Buddhism*

Guru Purnima – the day disciples offer worship or pay respect to their Guru; falls on the day of full moon in the month of Ashadh

Hindu*

Esala Full Moon Poya Day - commemorates the deliverance of the first sermon to the five ascetics and setting in motion the Wheel of the Dhamma (Dhammachakka) at Sarnath Benares, India; the sermon explains the Four Noble Truths: suffering, the cause of suffering, the cessation of suffering, and the path leading to the cessation of suffering

Sri Lanka*

Sultan's Birthday - honors the birth of Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, on this day in 1946 Brunei Darussalam 7.16 Birthday Imam Mahdi – celebration of the birthday of Iran*

Muhammad al-Mahdi (believed to be the ultimate
savior of humankind and the final Imam of the Twelve
Imams

Fiesta del la Virgen del Carmen - a festival mixing Andean pre-Columbian ceremonies and Catholic religion in which masked, costumed dancers relive ancient gods and rites Peru (Celendin)

Constitution Day - commemorates the proclamation of the constitution of the Republic of Korea in 1948

Asalha Puja - A Theraveda Buddhist celebration of the Buddha's first sermon and the setting of the Wheel of Truth into the world

El Dia de Los Niños – a day to honor children; observed the third Sunday of July

Constitution Day - commemorates the constitution of 1951 which set up a collegiate form of government

Uruguay

Umi no hi (The Day of the Sea) – also known as Marine Day, commemorates the Emperor's safe voyage and Japan's long seafaring traditions Japan

Nelson Mandela's Birthday - honors Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela, first President of South Africa to be elected in a fully representative democratic election, born on this day in 1918 South Africa

7.19 Martyrs' Day - commemorates the day in 1947 when Myanmar, several of Burma's independence leaders were gunned Burma down by a group of armed men in uniform while they were holding a cabinet meeting in downtown Rangoon **Liberation Day** - observes the day in 1979 that the Nicaragua army claimed victory over the dictator Anastasio Somoza Debayle Malaysia Birthday of Yang di-Pertuan Besar of Ng Sembilan (Negeri Sembilan) Edgar Degas's Birthday - celebrates the birth of Edgar France Degas, a French artist famous for his work in painting, sculpture, printmaking, and drawing, and considered one of the founders of Impressionism 7.20 Birthday of the Sultan of Terengganu Malaysia Colombia **Independence Day** - celebrates the day in 1810 when the country declared its independence from Spain Birthday of Crown Prince Haakon - marks the birth Norway of Haakon Magnus, Crown Prince of Norway, in 1973 in Oslo **Peace and Freedom Day** - marks the day in 1974 Cyprus when Turkish military intervention was launched to end the violence between Greek and Turkish Cypriots St. Elijah's Day - honors the memory of St. Prophet Bulgaria Elijah, one of the greatest Old Testament righteous men

7.21 Liberation Day - commemorates the day in 1944 that Guam U.S. forces freed the island from the Japanese

Independence Day - marks accession of Leopold I in 1931, after independence from the Netherlands

7.21 Schoelcher Day (Abolition of Slavery) - celebrated on the birthday of Victor Schoelcher, a French parliamentarian who lived and traveled on the islands of Guadeloupe and Martinique, becoming interested in the lives of black slaves. He worked to accomplish the abolishment of slavery in French territory in 1848

7.22 Revolution Day - commemorates the revolutionary dislodge of a reactionary government that misled, misinformed, and kept the Gambian masses out of the limelight of government activities

Birthday of King Sobhuza II - marks the birth of Ngwenyama Sobhuza II, Paramount Chief and later King of Swaziland for over 60 years Swaziland

7.23 Birth of Haile Selassie I - commemorates the 1982 birth of the former emperor of Ethiopia. He was born Tafari Makonnen and later took the name Haile Selassie, meaning Power of the Holy Trinity. The etymology of Rastafari is based on the word ras, meaning "prince", and Haile Selassie's birth name, Tafari

National Children's Day - a day to celebrate the lives of Indonesia's young people

7.24 Fiesta de Santiago - a festive and traditional pageant Peru of color, with exuberant dances and women in layered, multicolored skirts

Simón Bolívar Day - honors the life of Simon Jose Antonio de la Santisima Trinidad Bolivar Palacios y Blanco, one of the most important leaders of Spanish America's successful struggle for independence. He served as President of Gran Colombia, Peru, and Bolivia Venezuela & Ecuador

Birthday of Kuan Kung (God of War) - legend has it that during the second decade of the 12th century, the saltwater lake in the present day Xiezhou County gradually ceased to yield salt. The emperor was told that Chi You, a deity of war, was responsible. Kuan Kung battled with chi You over the lake and triumphed, allowing the lake to resume the production of salt. He is revered by followers of Taoism and Buddishm.

7.25 Papa Ogou (St. James the Greater) – Voodou holy day Haiti

National Day - commemorating the 54th anniversary of Egypt the Egyptian Revolution in 1952

Guanacaste Annexation Day - anniversary of the decision made by the people of Guanacaste in 1824 to become part of Costa Rica

Costa Rica

Republic Day - marks the founding of the republic in Tunisia 1957

Constitution Day – ratified in 1952

Puerto Rico

Foundation of Guayaquil Day - commemorates in founding of Guayaquil, the largest and the most populous city in Ecuador, as well as the nation's main port, on this day in 1538

Ecuador

Yalong Cultural Festival - an important component of Tibet the Tibetan culture, the festival includes games, folk dances, opera, and a Tibetan dress show

7.25 Galicia National Day - celebrated on the feast day of Spain St. James, Galicia is an autonomous community in northwest Spain, and was one of the first kingdoms of Europe

Gospel Day - a celebration with plays, singing, dancing, and music, this is a chance to experience both the traditional culture and the Christian heritage of the islands

Cook Islands (Rarotonga only)

Lunes del Cerro - a festival dedicated to the corn goddess, Centeotl. The festival is held to ask the gods for sufficient rain and a bountiful harvest. Observed the second Monday following July 16

7.26 National Day (Mancada Anniversary) – the anniversary Cuba of the assault on the Moncada Garrison in 1953 which sparked the Cuban Revolution and the reign of Fidel Castro

Independence Day – anniversary of independence from the United Kingdom in 1957

Maldives

Day of IANSA – a day to promote gun control

Brazil

Independence Day - commemorates the adoption of a constitution in 1847, thereby becoming Africa's first independent republic

Liberia

7.27 Victory Day – marks the end of the Korean War; the North Korea armistice was signed on this day in 1953

José Celso Barbosa's Birthday - celebrates Jose Celso Puerto Rico Barbosa, political leader of Puerto Rico known as the "father of the Statehood for Puerto Rico movement", and the first Puerto Rican with an American medical degree

Lu Pan Day - the festival day for Lu Pan, a builder, carpenter, and possessor of miraculous power believed to live around the time of 600 BC

Hong Kong

7.28 **Liberation Day** - a holiday commemorating Italian San Marino dictator Benito Mussolini's resignation in 1943 **Emancipation Day** – commemorates the abolition of Bermuda* slavery; celebrated the Thursday before the first Monday in August Olavsoka Eve - celebrated on the eve before the Faroe Islands Faroese Parliament opens its session, this celebration includes a cavalcade and boat races **Independence Day** - marks the day in 1821 when Peru independence from Spain was declared; Spanish rule ended in 1824 Bermuda* Somer's Day - Bermuda was discovered by Admiral 7.29 Sir George Somers on this day in 1609 Maetresse Silverine & Maetresse Lorvana - Silverine Voodou* only very slightly tastes of the food offered to her and Lorvana smells flowers for her nurishment St. Olav's Day - a day to celebrate St. Olav, the patron **Norway** saint of Norway, and king of Norway from 1015-1028 **Fete du Trone** (Enthronement) – to celebrate the 7.30 Morocco ascension to the throne of King Mohammed VI **Independence Day** - commemorates independence Vanuatu gained in 1980 MicMac Festival of St. Ann - a religious festival which Canada attracts MicMac Indian people from all parts of Nova Scotia Feast of St. Ignatius Loyola - commemorates the life Spain* of St. Ignatius Loyola (1491-1556), who founded the Society of Jesus, the Roman Catholic religious order whose members are known as Jesuits; celebrated the last weekend in July

7.31 Upswing of the Revolution

Congo

Verslunarmannahelgi - celebrates the constitution of Iceland* 1874; also known as Shop and Office Workers' Holiday; observed the weekend before the first Monday in August
