10.1 Cyprus Independence Day – after a five-year struggle, Cyprus won its independence from the UK in 1960

Cyprus

People's Republic of China Birthday - a two-day celebration of the founding of the People's Republic of China in 1949

China

Unification Day - marks the anniversary of the British Southern Cameroons' independence from the United Kingdom and unification with French Cameroun in 1961

Cameroon

Captains Regent Day – the day on which the two heads of state, the two "Regent Captains," are invested with their powers in Piazza Liberta; occurs twice per year

San Marino

Independence Day - the Compact of Free Association took effect on this day in 1994; it established a constitutional government in free association with the United States

South Korea

Independence Day - commemorates three events: when Nigeria gained independence from Britain in 1960, became a federal republic with new constitution in 1963, and restored to civilian rule in 1979

Mehregan (Autumn Festival) – also known as the Persian Festival of Autumn, is an ancient Persian fest which is dedicated to Mehr (or Mithra/Mitra), the goddess and symbol of light, friendship, faith, love and kindness

National Day - commemorates the founding of Hong Kong People's Republic of China on this day in 1949

Tuvalu Day (Independence Day) - commemorates Tuvalu independence from the United Kingdom

International Music Day - proclaimed by the UN/UNESCO in 1975 as an annual event to celebrate music

10.2 Gandhi Jayanti - marks the birth of Mahatma India Gandhi in 1869; he was born in Porbander, India, and is honored as a leader of Indian nationalism and Hindu religious beliefs

Independence Day – celebrates independence from Guinea France in 1958

Tag der Deutschen Einheit (Day of German Unity) - Germany commemorates the date in 1990 when East and West Germany were reunited as one country

Day of the Francisco Morazán (Soldiers' Day) - Honduras honors General Jose Francisco Morazán Quezada, a Central American statesman, lawyer, and orator born in Honduras in 1792. He was also the leader of the Liberal Party, President of the Federal Republic of Central America, and Head of state of Honduras, Guatemala, El Salvador, and Costa Rica

Independence Day – on this day in 1932, Iraq attained independence from the United Kingdom

10.3 **Tangun Day** (National Foundation Day) – on this day South Korea in 2333 BCE, the legendary Tangun, founder of the nation, established his kingdom of Chosun **Labour Day** – a celebration of the achievements of South organized labor on behalf of the worker to bring Australia, New about the 8-hour day in the late 1850's; observed the South Wales, first Monday in October Australia Capital Territory* 10.4 **Peace Day** - anniversary of the signing of the 1992 Mozambique Peace General Agreement that put an end to the war in Mozambique Lesotho **Independence Day** - commemorates independence from the United Kingdom in 1966 **St. Petronius Day** - the feast day of St. Petronius, Italy Bishop of Bologna renowned in Italy for his virtues 10.5 **Republic Day** - celebrates the end of the Monarchy Portugal and the beginning of the Portuguese Republic **Constitution Day** – commemorates the signing of Vanuatu the constitution on this day in 1979 Taiwan* **Double Ninth Day** – a traditional Chinese holiday and Taoist festival celebrated on the 9th day of the 9th lunar month; defined by a double dose of this potent yang energy is considered to be imbalanced, in a potentially dangerous way; people do things to protect themselves, including climbing mountains, drinking chrysanthemum wine, and carrying sprigs of Dogwood; some visit the graves of their ancestors, as a way to pay respect on Double Ninth Day **National Sports Day** Lesotho

10.9	Independence Day – independence from Britain was secured on this day in 1962	Uganda
	Nangul Day – commemorates the invention and proclamation of hangul, the native alphabet of the Korean language	South Korea
	Death of Henri Christophe – honors the key leader in the Haitian Revolution whose leadership helped win independence from France in 1804. He served as President of the State of Haiti in 1807 and proclaimed himself Henri I, King of Haiti, in 1811	Haiti

10.9 Independence Day - commemorates independence Croatia from Yugoslavia in 1991

Independence of Guayaquil Day - anniversary of the day in 1820 when a group of civilians supported by soldiers from the Granaderos de Reserva overwhelmed the resistance of the Royalist guards and declared independence from Spain Ecuador

Cirio de Nazare - the start of the two-week "Candle Procession" of northern Brazil celebrated since the last part of the eighteenth century; observed the second Sunday of October

10.10 Moi Day – a day set aside to honor the accomplishments of Moi, their former president, who died in 1978

Kenya

Independence War - marks the beginning of the Ten Cuba Year's War in 1868 when sugar mill owner Carlos Manuel de Cespedes and his followers proclaimed Cuba's independence from Spain

Double Tenth Day (Wuchang Uprising) – commemorates the proclamation of the Chinese Republic in 1911

Taiwan

Sports Day (taiku no hi) – staged by schools and offices, people take part in competitive sporting activities; also known as field day; usually held on the second Monday in October

Party Foundation Day – commemorates the founding meeting of the North Korea Bureau of the Communist Party of Korea on this day in 1945

Columbus Day (Dia de la Raza) - a celebration of the arrival of Christopher Columbus in the Americas; observed the second Monday in October

10.13 Anniversary of Rwagasore's Assassination - Burundi

anniversary of the assassination of Prince Louis Rwagasore, Burundi nationalist, prime minister, and founder of the Union for National Progress

Succot (Tabernacles) – commemorates the wandering of the Jews in the wilderness after their Exodus from the hands of the Egyptians, when they had to dwell in makeshift booths or huts

Judaism

10.14 Svetitskhovloba (Georgia Orthodox Festival) - Georgia

celebration of the first Christian church in Georgia; according to chronicles, holy chyton (shirt) of the Savior is buried under this church

October Revolution (National Day) – commemorates Yemen the revolts of 1962

President's Day - Birthday of President Mobutu Zaire

Petkouden – the feast day of St. Petka, or Paraskevi Bulgaria

Santa Fortunata - a day to honor Santa Fortunata, a martyr from the early days of Christianity, whose remains rest in an urn in the church of Santo Domingo; on the eve locals prepare for the verbena (night festival) and the burning of fireworks announcing the holiday

Peru

Nyerere Day - a day to honor the first president of the United Republic of Tanzania, Julius Kambarage Nyerere (who died on this day in 1999), who is considered the father of the country

10.15 Mother's Day

Evacuation Day - commemorates the withdrawal of Tunisia French troops in 1962

Cayenne Festival - a festival in the capital city of French Guiana featuring dance and light shows

10.15 National Tree Planting Day

Rectification Day - marks the day in 1987 when President Blaise Compaore launched the Movement of Rectification that led to the establishment of democratic institutions, leading to political freedom and economic renewal in the framework of regional and global integration

Burkina Faso

Karva Chauth – on this day married women observe a fast and pray for the long life, well being and prosperity of their husband; after the fast, in the evening, family and friends gather to exchange gifts and share a home-cooked meal Hindu

10.16 St. Gallus Day - the feast day of St. Gall

Switzerland

World Food Day – commemorates the founding of the United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO); this year's theme is *Food prices* – *From crisis to stability* International

Chung Yeung Festival - a day to respect and remember ancestors; families journey to the graves of their ancestors to perform cleansing rites and pay their respects

Hong Kong

10.17 International Day for the Eradication of Poverty - International

a campaign by the UN to make poverty history; it was first observed this day in 1987, on which over a hundred thousand people gathered at the Trocadero in Paris, where the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was signed in 1948; attendees proclaimed that poverty is a violation of human rights and affirmed the need to come together to ensure that these rights are respected

Peru

Senor de Luren - celebrated in Ica the third week of October; Senor de Luren is the patron saint of Ica

10.17 Peniamina Gospel Day – to honor a native of Nuie Nuie* who was successful in converting his fellow islanders to Christianity

Dessalines Day - anniversary of the death of Jean Jacques Dessalines, a revolutionary who was declared emperor in 1805

Haiti

National Heroes' Day – honors Jamaica's seven national heroes; observed the third Monday in October

Jamaica*

Feast of St. Margaret Alacoque - the feast day of Saint Marquerite Marie Alacoque, a French Roman Catholic nun and mystic, who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in its modern form; she is the patron saint of those suffering with polio and those who have lost their parents

St. Lucia

10.18 Independence Day - commemorates independence Azerbaijan from the Soviet Union in 1991

National Flag Day – first observed on this day in 1817

Chile

Persons Day - anniversary of the day in 1929 when the appeals court for the Canadian Supreme Court ruled that women were eligible "persons" and could therefore be appointed to the Senate Canada

10.19 Constitution Celebration - commemorates the Nuie Schedules of the Niue Constitution Act on this day in

1974

Samora Machel Day - celebrated on the anniversary of Samora Moises Machel's death; Machel was a Mozambican military commander, revolutionary socialist leader and eventual President of Mozambique; he led the country to independence and served as president until his death in 1986

10.25 **Retrocession Day** - celebrates the return of Taiwan Taiwan to Chinese rule after the defeat of Japan in 1945, thereby ending 55 years of Japanese colonial occupation

Grenada

Thanksgiving Day - commemorates the anniversary of the 1983 Caribbean and American military intervention in Grenada; on this date a joint military force landed in Grenada to restore order to the country following the deaths of then Prime Minister Maurice Bishop and a number of his colleague

Constitution Day – anniversary of the approval by referendum of the Constitution on this day in 1992 Lithuania

10.26 **Armed Forces Day**

Benin & Rwanda

Angam Day - a day of celebration and a time of reflection for the Nauruan people; twice in its history, the Nauruan population fell below 1,500, and the Nauruan ethnic group has been considered in danger of extinction; upon eclipsing a population of 1,500, Angam Day was declared

Nauru

Diwali/Deepavali (Festival of Lights) – a joyous celebration for all; earthen lamps are lit and everyone is adorned in new and brightly colored clothing

Hindu*

National Day - commemorates the day in 1955 when Austria the Soviet Union ended its occupation, and a constitutional law of perpetual Austrian neutrality was enacted

St. Demetrius Day - the feast day of Saint Demetrius of Thessaloniki, a Christian martyr who is said to have lived in the early 4th century

Bulgaria

Peniamina Day (Gospel Day) - anniversary of the creation of the first church by Fakafitifonua and Peniamina; observed the fourth Friday in October Nuie*

10.27	Govardhana Puja/Laxhmi Puja – celebrated as the day Krishna defeated Indra; Lord Krishna taught people to worship nature, as mountains bring rains to earth and to stop worshiping the God of Rains, Lord Indra	Nepal

10.30 Creole Day - a celebration of Dominica's Creole language and culture which includes traditional dancing, folklore, food, and music

10.31 Halloween – a Pagan holiday on which the hostile supernatural forces are believed to wander freely

US & Scotland

Day of Reformation - a religious holiday celebrated in remembrance of the Christian reform movement in Europe begun by Martin Luther

Germany & Slovenia

Former King's Birthday, Norodom Sihanouk - commemorates the birthday of King Father Norodom Sihanouk

Cambodia

Samhain - the first day of the New Year and marks the move from summer to winter in the Northern Hemisphere; this harvest festival, one of the "Greater Sabbats," honors Saman, an ancient lord of the dead; according to folklore, on this day the souls of all those who had died the previous year gather

Pagan

Chiang Kai-shek's Birthday - born on this day in 1887, Chiang Kai-shek served as Generalissimo of the Nationalist Government of the Republic of China from 1928 to 1948; he also served as President of the Republic of China
