Honduras Mission Trip: A new approach to global health

Sergio A. Alvarado, MD participated in a two-week medical mission trip to San Jose, Intibuca, Honduras in May 2011. Other participants included residents and faculty from the Rochester New York Family Medicine Residency program. This mission trip was unique in that it incorporated other facets of Honduran life including economics, education, and health prevention. Dr. Alvarado's presentation will highlight other projects that were spawned by the mission and the outcome of these projects on the community of San Jose.

A native of El Paso, Dr. Alvarado earned a Bachelor's degree in Biology from Our Lady of the Lake University in San Antonio. He completed his medical degree at the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara. His interests in sports medicine and international health have grown since beginning his residency program. He is a resident member of the AAFP, TAFP, AMSSM, WMS, STFM, AMA, and NAPCRG. He was elected House Staff President and currently serves as one of two Chiefs.
