Katie Chung will finish her fourth year of medical school this spring. Since starting medical school she has been very involved in the development of global health opportunities for Texas Tech medical students. This spring she spent one month in a farming hub-city in Northern Nicaragua working in various venues to improve the health and well being of the population. She focused on the improvement of oral health, and in collaboration with Nicaraguan dental students she began a three year prospective study. The three year study will examine how tooth brushing can prevent the progression of tooth decay in rural Nicaraguan children between ages six and nine.

Katie will begin a Family Medicine residency program at Oregon Health Science Center in Portland, OR in July 2010.
