Ambassador Tibor P. Nagy, Jr. currently serves as Vice Provost for International Affairs at Texas Tech University. During the 2002 academic year he was the Department of State's "Diplomat in Residence" at the University of Oklahoma. Previously he served as the U.S. Ambassador to Ethiopia (1999-2002) and Ambassador to Guinea (1996-1999). Over the years Ambassador Nagy has lived or worked in Zambia, Seychelles, Ethiopia, Togo, Cameroon, and Nigeria.

Ambassador Nagy was born in Budapest Hungary and arrived in the U.S. as a political refugee in 1957. He received a B.A. from Texas Tech University and an M.S.A. from George Washington University. He is the recipient of numerous awards including the Department of State's "Superior Honor" award, five "Meritorious Honor" awards, as well as runner-up for the prestigious "Deputy Chief of Mission of the Year" award.
