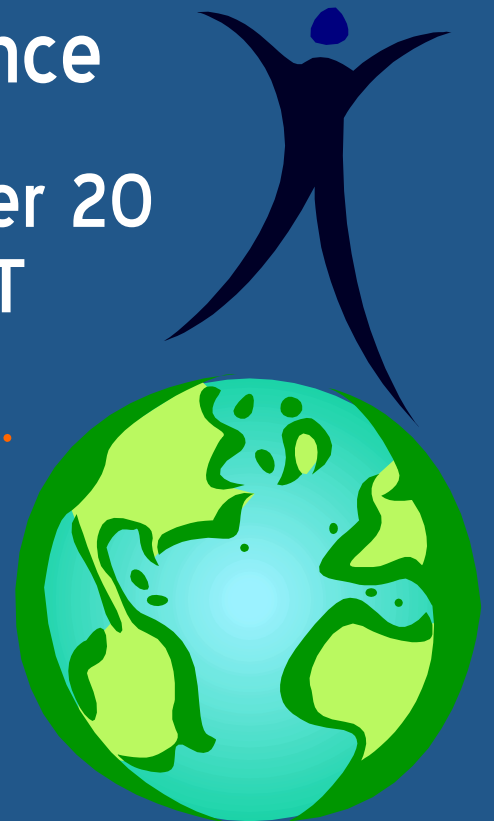
Healthcare Challenges in Resource Poor Settings: The Papua New Guinea Experience
