Founded by Andrea, a former professional motorcycle racer, and Barry Coleman, a journalist, Riders for Health is an award-winning, non-profit organization instrumental in delivering health care to rural and remote communities in sub-Saharan Africa.

For over 20 years, Riders for Health has managed over 1,400 vehicles used in the delivery of health services. The organization's goal is to mobilize health workers on well-managed motorcycles, ambulances, and other four-wheeled vehicles, addressing the issue of inaccessible health care and allowing health workers to increase their productivity and coverage. Riders trains health workers to ride and conduct routine maintenance on motorcycles, allowing them to reach six times more people and provide essential health education, disease surveillance, immunizations, maternal and child health services, and HIV counseling. Riders also trains local technicians to maintain and repair the vehicles, keeping their own inventory of spare parts, essential when a simple fan belt can mean the difference between life and death.
