Purpose Medical Mission, founded by Sixtus Atabong, P.A., a former TTUHSC Allied Health student, was created to provide quality healthcare programs and services to the people of the southwest province of Cameroon. It aims to establish health clinics and urgent care centers in small towns and farming villages in order to enhance preventative care and treat minor illnesses and injuries.

Since 2008, volunteers through Purpose Medical Mission have traveled to Cameroon to build and stock a clinic and to provide medical services. Nicole Hines will share her experiences from the summer 2010 mission. She will provide a glimpse into the difficulty of executing such a large undertaking and touch on the goals and challenges of providing excellent care with very little supplies or resources.
