TARGET AUDIENCE

The 5th Annual Obstetrics and Gynecology Symposium has been designed for physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, nurses, other health care professionals and medical and nursing students who face ever increasing challenges in El Paso, Texas and the US/Mexico border.

CONCEPT

Focus will be on the clinical diagnoses, treatment options, and new technologies involved in obstetrics, gynecology and neonatology.

OBJECTIVES

Upon the completion of this activity the participants should be able to:

- Discuss the complexities of the health care system in the US and its effect on women's and children's health.
- 2. Evaluate current maternal mortality in the US incorporating morbid factors that affect mortality and how health care providers can ameliorate some of these conditions.
- 3. Analyze the pitfalls and safeguards needed for elective inductions and its effect on neonatal morbidity/mortality.
- 4. Discuss diagnosis, treatment of pregnant women with H1N1 utilizing evidence-based medicine.
- 5. Assimilate diagnoses, treatment and care of neonates with nutritional challenges.
- Analyze innovations and challenges in obstetric anesthesia including spinal epidural blocks in providing obstetric care.
- 7. Analyze the frequency and underlying causes of maternal mortality in rural and urban settings.
- 8. Discuss key role principals of the Certified Nurse Midwife in providing care to women.
- Assess and evaluate current practices in physician-patient communication and their importance to improved patient care.
- 10. Analyze current minimally invasive surgical procedures in Gynecology and Urogynecology in providing preventive measures for women's health.
- 11. Expand and describe the impact of uterine fibroids on reproductive failure and related indications for removing them.
- 12. Identify current women's health research initiatives and how they translate to the delivery of care in El Paso.
